5. INFORMATION ITEM –

a. Mr. Richards' report included:

- a. Mr. Achilles Williams, Caerus Accounting and Tax Firm Senior Advisor, provided an update on the status of the agency's financial reconciliation and budget preparation.
 - i. Achilles noted that his team has completed the reconciliation for the two largest accounts: the General account and the Payroll account. There are seven remaining smaller accounts that still require reconciliation, and these are expected to be completed in a shorter timeframe.
 - ii. The reconciliation effort covers the full calendar year, January through December. Once the reconciliation process is fully completed, the team will present the October, November, and December financial statements to the Board.
 - iii. In addition, Achilles advised that with the updated and reconciled financials, the team will be in a position to complete the proposed budget and bring it forward for Board consideration and approval in February.

- iv. Additional updates will be provided as the reconciliation progresses and materials are finalized for presentation.
- b. Ms. Shannon Porche, CATS Human Resources Director, along with Alliant VP of Employee Benefits, Mike Tucker provided a Root Cause Analysis of the recent Health Coverage termination. Ms. Porche and Mr. Tucker noted that the benefits were not terminated and could still be used on a manual basis. The issue was immediately addressed and has been resolved as of January 12.

2. Paratransit Update - Ms. Denman provided the ADA reports for October, November and December 2025. In October, 9,948 rides were completed, in November 8,679 rides were completed, and in December 9,243 rides were completed. The number of applications mailed from 350 N. Donmoor: October - 23, November - 25 and December – 18. Applications mailed by other agencies were reported as: October – 8, November – 11, and December – 7. The number of applications that were certified were October – 25, November – 27, December – 21. Ms. Denman noted that the service is growing rapidly, and local hospitals are referring us along with other medical facilities.
3. Customer Service – Sylvia Franklin
Interim Director of Operations, Mr. James Payton provided the customer service report on behalf of Ms. Franklin.
He noted that productivity for the months of October, November and December. In October, 25,682 calls were answered with a 99.78% productivity rate. In November, 25,685 calls were answered with a 99.78% productivity rate. In December, 25,181 calls were answered with a 99.85% productivity rate. The monthly average for customer service reps answered was 99.75% for both October and November, and 99.82% for December.

4. Service Complaints – Demetrius Gulley

Interim Director of Operations Mr. James Payton provided the service complaints on behalf of Ms. Gulley. The report included more detailed categories than previously reported such as disruptive customers, rude employees, and unsafe vehicle operation. For October, November and December, there were a total of 82 complaints. All complaints reported were reviewed by video footage and confirmed that they were valid. There were 22 pass up complaints, 23 disruptive customer complaints, 20 rude employee complaints, 9 late bus complaints, and 8 unsafe vehicle operation complaints.

5. Communication Quarterly Update – Jada Davis

Mr. Davis noted the views, engagements, post link clicks and engagement rate for each social media platform for the months of October, November and December. Overall, the numbers have increased as a result of a few reasons. Those reasons range from improved content, more interactive posts, more shares, etc. CATS had a total of five media reports for the months of October, November, and December. The nature of the stories was: one neutral story (fare free rides to polls); one positive (sponsored content, focusing on the new GeauxPass app that will launch soon) and two negative stories (both regarding the recent resignation of the CFO).

6. Service Change Summary – Brandon Songy

Mr. Songy gave an update on the service change that is tentatively scheduled to begin on Sunday, March 8, 2026.

7. LYNX By CATS Quarterly Update - Brandon Songy

Mr. Songy reported LYNX ridership for the months of October, November and December. LYNX by CATS completed 4,905 rides in the month of October; 3,750 in November and 4,976 in December. The average pick up time was 19 minutes in October, and 18 minutes in both November and December.

RECOMMENDATION:

Mansfield Oil has approved a new contract with the State of Louisiana for fuel. The contract is good through **February 10, 2027**. CATS is asking the board to approve a 1-year renewal with Mansfield Oil until the end of the year, January 1, 2026, thru Dec 31, 2026 (See attached info.).

CATS has found this contract to be an advantageous partnership with Mansfield Oil. Therefore, CATS is recommending the renewal of the contract for an additional 1 year for the period of **January 1, 2026, through Dec 31, 2026**

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The contract fuel prices are based on the weekly published Oil Price Information Services (OPIS) plus an administrative consignment “mark-up” fee of \$0.060, plus applicable taxes. The calculation is OPIS + Mark-up + Applicable Taxes = Price Per Gallon (PPG).

Utilizing an automatic fuel dispensing service allows CATS to only pay for the amount of diesel fuel actually used, rather than the gallons dumped into CATS on-site two (2) 10,000-gallon tanks. This contract also allows CATS to obtain gasoline fuel for service cars, small para-transit vans, lawn equipment, etc., from the designated City Parish DPW maintenance lots. The price for gasoline is calculated the same way as described above for diesel, except that the fuel tank locations are not located on CATS premises. Billing is kept separate for CATS for payment purposes and tax exemption status.






