## **ESSENTIAL DUTIES:**

- Inspects for and reports torn seats, rotting floors, cracked windows, loose mirrors, worn or damaged tires, fluid leaks, improper or unusual odors, etc.
- Perform custodial building maintenance in the garage, such as sweeping and washing floors
- Perform periodic maintenance work on service equipment such as the bus washer
